Elm Drive Play area Update:

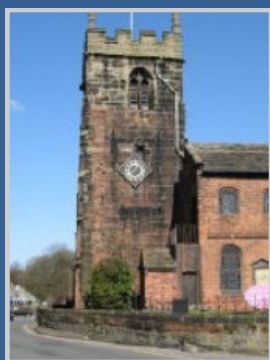
Following the success of the changes to the Middlewich Road play area, we, with the Parish Council, are turning our attention to the Elm Drive play area. We sought people's opinions via both a questionnaire sent to local residents and seeking ideas at the Village Fair.

As a result, we are planning both to upgrade the main (fenced off) area and provide a fitness area alongside, with a track for running and cycling and a 'trim trail'. If all goes to plan, we should complete this by the middle of next year.

'Save Saltersford Corner'

The campaign is currently working around both the resubmission of the plans and the appeal that followed the refusal of the planning application. The planning meeting is scheduled for mid-September and the appeal date is unknown at present.
