Pedestrian Safety Petition Update

A big **THANK YOU** to everyone who signed our petition asking Cheshire Highways for safe crossing points to be provided at the village crossroads (Chester-Station Road/London Road junction), especially in the light of the plan to replace the existing traffic lights with a roundabout in the near future.

We are delighted to announce that there was a total of 942 signatures on the petition – split between the online and paper versions. The petition was presented to the Leader of Cheshire East Council, Rachel Bailey, on 12th April by Partnership Chairman, Stuart Gammon.



We have subsequently received a response from Andrew Ross, the Director of Infrastructure & Highways at Cheshire East Council, saying:

“Whilst this improvement is focussed on improving capacity of the junction and thereby reducing congestion, providing facilities for pedestrians is equally important. The detailed design of the roundabout scheme has not yet commenced but it is intended that the scheme will include a number of controlled pedestrian crossings that will allow pedestrians to cross the A50 London Road and also the A54 Chester Road.

“Once a draft scheme design has been completed, the Council will then undertake a consultation with the Parish Council / Ward Members and local residents to gain their views on the proposed scheme design.”

Holmes Chapel Partnership will be pressing for involvement at the start of the design process, so that the local community’s views can be represented from the beginning of the process, and thereby minimise issues at the public consultation stage.

NEWS

Changes to Data Protection Legislation - GDPR

From May 25th new Data Protection legislation takes effect, in the form of the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR). In order to comply GDPR we need to ensure that Holmes Chapel Partnership has your permission to hold, and use information about you; in particular this applies to two things the Partnership does:

Circulation of the Community Newsletter and Partnership Updates via email

The Partnership holds a list of personal and organisation email addresses for the purpose of emailing:

- A link to the latest Community Newsletter to subscribers every month
- Updates on Partnership activity, and notices of the Annual General Meeting

At the beginning of April an email was sent to every individual and organisation on our list, asking for one of the following responses:

- *I agree to Holmes Chapel Partnership holding my email address for the purpose of sending Newsletters and other updates*
- *Please remove my email address from the Holmes Chapel Partnership email list*

If you want to continue to receive the Newsletter by email each month, and haven't already done so, it is **essential** that you provide your consent - using the words above - by email to chairman@hcpartnership.org.uk before 25th May.

- *The GDPR legislation states that we are not allowed to assume consent; therefore, if no response is received by the 25th May, we will be unable to send out these emails to the individual or organisation involved after that date (i.e. starting with the June Community Newsletter email) – until we receive formal consent.*

Creation and maintenance of the New Residents Welcome Pack and the List of Organisations on the Partnership website

Since 2012 we have maintained a Welcome Pack for New Residents, which lists local organisations and services operating in Holmes Chapel and the immediate area, and provides details of contacts for each; this information is also held on our website on the Local Organisations pages. Note: We are currently revising the information in order to replace the Welcome Pack with a new, enhanced **Holmes Chapel Guide**, in the form of a printed A5 booklet.

Under the new GDPR regulations we need to have **explicit permission** to publish (personal) contact information – this means contacts' names, phone numbers, email addresses. In order to comply with the legislation we have emailed each organization listed, seeking permission to publish these details – both in the booklet and online.

Train Timetables Changing

We have been advised by the Station Manager, Graham, at Holmes Chapel Railway Station, that new timetables come into force on Sunday 20th May.

- We strongly recommend checking the new timetable before setting off after this date!

Note: The new timetables are currently being printed and should be available early May; downloadable versions are due to be released on 7th May.

PCSO Blog – Liz Chesters

I am your local officer for Dane Valley and Brereton Rural – PCSO Liz Chesters.

It seems that as the nights have grown lighter and the weather a tad warmer we have seen a small increase of anti-social behaviour in Dane Valley. It has been a priority of Sandbach beat team recently to target certain areas and individuals that are involving themselves in these incidents. I have repeatedly informed our local policing unit of the issues we are seeing to ensure more visible patrols are committed to the area, and that we take positive action when we are dealing with any incidents to ensure we can put a stop to it.



An example of this is an incident we were alerted to in Holmes Chapel regarding a group of youths. On attendance we were aware that an individual was suspected to be in possession of an illegal substance, and therefore two males and a vehicle were searched. The outcome was that an illegal substance was seized, destroyed and effectively taken off the streets of our community. I am committed to making sure this type of behaviour does not become normal practice and will continue to act on information provided on any individuals we suspect to be involved. Furthermore I am extremely thankful to the residents who continue to support our work in Dane Valley by providing this information – you can do the same [anonymously online](#) or call Crimestoppers on **0800 555 111**.

Since starting in September last year, I have always made it a priority to engage with young people in the community and I continue to do so by monitoring parking at the local schools in the area. Some schools are less unfortunate and do not have the facilities for parents or guardians to park their vehicles and this does lead to inconsiderate parking on roads. Brereton Primary school is just one of the nine schools I cover, however it is here that I have recently focused on my school patrols as I have received complaints of vehicles being left in residents driveways, at the corner of junctions and on the yellow zig zag lines in front of the school. I must re-iterate the risk you are putting these children in by doing one of the above and I will take action against drivers who think it is acceptable to do so. On a nicer note it is a great way to engage with the children and help build a rapport as it is important that they know I am here to help. Seeing their happy faces on the way into school (perhaps not on a Monday morning!) does motivate me to make their community a better place to be.

On my recent foot patrols, I have been asked by residents if I will be hosting another Working Together meeting which were previously held in the village of Holmes Chapel to help the residents and community engage with me. I do feel that these meetings were beneficial for a policing purpose but also to help residents get to know their community support officer. I have some news that we will be gaining a new beat manager for Dane Valley very soon and therefore I am hoping to let you know where and when our next meeting will be, and bring along our new officer to introduce you to them. Watch this space!

I know in previous articles I have provided my email address for you to contact me, which I am more than happy for you to use however I have concerns that I am not always available to check those emails and sometimes incidents are being reported to me and not being responded to as quickly as we would like. Therefore, if you need to report an incident, please do try to ring 101 first (999 if it is an emergency situation). Alternatively, a request to raise any concern to me can be made via the Cheshire Police website to our general contact box (<https://www.cheshire.police.uk/contact/contact-an-officer/>), which is manned by an available PCSO, but not necessarily your local community support officer. This ensures that you are being responded to in a timely manner, and that I can deal with the concerns when I am next on duty.

- The Parish Council has agreed to go ahead with the project; funding has been secured from Holmes Chapel Partnership, together with a grant from Anita Armit
- Quotes for the landscaping work have been received, and a contractor has been selected
- A final plan has been prepared for the planting of the area

As the existing trees are coming into blossom, and the shrubs/plants will flower over the next few months, it has been decided to postpone the landscaping work until mid-summer, after which the new planting can take place.

Nick & Freya's Great Manchester Run

Nick and Freya Lewis are running the Great Manchester run on 20th May for **MANCHESTER UNIVERSITY NHS FOUNDATION TRUST CHARITY** because they saved Freya's life following the Manchester Arena bombing.



This is their story:

On the 22nd May 2017 our lives were changed forever when our youngest daughter, Freya, was seriously injured in the MEN Arena Attack; her friend, Nell, was tragically killed. For the next five weeks Freya was cared for by the wonderful staff at Royal Manchester Children's Hospital. She continues to be a regular visitor to the hospital as an outpatient and has further surgery planned there this year.

Prior to the 22nd May, I enjoyed running for exercise, regularly doing a 6K circuit 2 to 3 times a week. After the attack, I did on one occasion when I was struggling try running again, but it's a time that I tend to think and I found it impossible to cope with my memories and emotions. I didn't run again in 2017.

In January this year I was contacted by RMCH asking whether I was willing to be involved in their fundraising activity for the 2018 Great Manchester Run 10K. I was torn between the desire to do anything that I could to help the hospital and my concern about the effect that running again would have on my state of mind. However, later in the month I decided to give it a try and was pleased to find that I could deal with the emotional side of things; it was just the physical element that was a problem!

Hence, on the 20th May 2018 I will be wearing my Humphrey T-Shirt with pride and running around Manchester to raise money for RMCH. When I am running, I will be thinking of all of the 22 people who needlessly lost their lives on that horrific night, their families, and the hundreds of other people injured and affected by the atrocity.

Last year we set up a Just Giving page in Freya's name and raised over £24,000 for RMCH through peoples overwhelming generosity. In some ways, I feel guilty now asking for people to donate more money. However, I also agreed to be part of RMCH promotional video for the Manchester 10K. A link to the video is provided below. The shame that I have put both myself and my family through in appearing in this film must be worth a few quid!

On 7th March, Freya decided that she wanted to run (or maybe walk!) the Junior Run on 20th May, which is 2.5k. She was due to have surgery the previous week, but the hospital has kindly deferred this so that she is able to do the run. Needless to say, we are incredibly proud of our daughter who amazes us more with every passing day.

Cheshire East Council are currently conducting a wheelie bin consultation:

- Cheshire East Council currently provides a range of wheeled bins, with a charge applied only to additional garden waste bins. The council has been experiencing a high level of bin supply requests and this level of demand is placing an unsustainable pressure on the budget and needs to be addressed. We are therefore proposing to implement a bin supply charge for this service.

FIONA BRUCE - DIARY:



4th April 2018: Welcoming deposit return scheme in fight against plastic

Fiona Bruce MP has welcomed the announcement of a deposit return scheme to increase recycling rates and slash the amount of waste polluting our land and seas. The scheme will be introduced, subject to consultation, later this year.

6th April 2018: Annual meeting of North West England Trefoil Guilds in Sandbach

As a Guide Ambassador for Cheshire, Fiona attended the AGM of the Trefoil Guild for North West England. Guilds from across the North West were represented by several hundred Guides who met at St Mary's Church, Sandbach, to hear reports of very active groups from across the region.

6th April 2018: Raising awareness of Jobcentre Plus Travel Discount Card to help jobseekers into work

Fiona Bruce is supporting the Rail Delivery Group's initiative, on behalf of Britain's train companies, to raise awareness about a travel discount card that helps lower the cost of finding work.

The Jobcentre Plus Travel Discount Card is available to eligible people in England, Wales and Scotland who have been out of work for 12 weeks or longer. It offers jobseekers a 50% discount on train fares as they travel to interviews, to the Jobcentre or to and from training, for up to three months at a time.

23rd April 2018: Ban on ivory sales

Fiona Bruce MP has welcomed the Government's confirmation that a ban on ivory sales will be introduced. The Environment Secretary Gove confirmed that the UK will introduce a ban on ivory sales and has set out the Government's plans to help protect elephants for future generations.

23rd April 2018: Free speech in Universities

The Joint Committee on Human Rights, of which Fiona Bruce, MP for Congleton, and Jeremy Lefroy, MP for Stafford, are both members, has published a report into free speech in universities, highlighting serious concerns over barriers to free speech.

23rd April 2018: Additional support for children of alcohol dependent parents

Fiona Bruce MP, Chair of the All-Party Parliamentary Group (APPG) on Alcohol Harm and Vice-Chair of the APPG for Children of Alcoholics, has welcomed this morning's announcement by the Government of £6 million to help identify at-risk children more quickly, and provide them with rapid access to support and advice. It is estimated 200,000 children in England living with alcohol-dependent parents.

23rd April 2018: Prostate cancer treatment

Fiona spoke at a House of Commons debate about the treatment of prostate cancer.

Speaking after the debate, Fiona Bruce said "Over the almost 8 years I have been MP here, constituents have contacted me concerned about prostate cancer treatment and have been involved in campaigning for improvements and so I was particularly pleased to put on record the Government's increased investment in this area."

24th April 2018: Change to policy on Sunday School inspections

Congleton MP Fiona Bruce has welcomed a newly-published Government report admitting that the UK public strongly reject proposals to have Ofsted inspect and oversee 'out-of-school education settings' such as scouts or church Sunday schools.
