

HS2 Consultation

On 11th October the Secretary of State for Transport announced the launch of two HS2 consultations for the section of the route from Crewe to Manchester and West Midlands to Leeds, which is known as Phase 2b. These consultations are on:

- **The working draft Environmental Statement** that describes the potential environmental effects of building and operating Phase 2b of HS2; as well as proposed ways to avoid, reduce, mitigate and monitor the effects.
- **The working draft Equality Impact Assessment Report** that considers the potential effects of the construction and operation of HS2 Phase 2b on people with protected characteristics.

Both consultations will close at 23:45 on 21 December 2018.

We invite you to take part in these consultations. Feedback will be considered as we further develop our proposals. An Environmental Statement and Equality Impact Assessment Report will then be submitted to Parliament alongside the hybrid Bill in mid-2020.

To support these consultations, we are holding a series of information events from late October to early December 2018. The events will be attended by a range of specialists from HS2 Ltd and the Department for Transport to guide people through the consultation documents. In addition, reference copies of the consultation documents are available at a number of locations during the consultation period. We have also produced a series of videos to introduce and explain the consultations. These are available via the website along with a new interactive tool that has been designed to help people find the information in the working draft Environmental Statement most relevant to them.

PCSO Blog for October

I am your local officer for Dane Valley – PCSO Liz Chesters.

Your local beat team has been out and about on patrol in Dane Valley recently and we are pleased to say we have noticed a decrease in the reports of anti-social behaviour being reported. This has been re-iterated through visits to the local primary schools to ensure that the children know what we expect over the October half term.

Officers from Crewe CID are appealing for witnesses to come forward following a burglary at The Trading Post convenience store in Goostrey.

Detective Constable Gail Burndred said: "Investigations in relation incident are ongoing, and we are currently following a number of lines of enquiry, including CCTV analysis and forensics.

"While the victims in this case were not threatened, they have understandably been left shaken as a result of their ordeal, and we are committed to doing all we can to trace the people responsible. As part of my enquiries I am keen to hear from anyone who believes that they have any information which could assist the investigation.

"I urge anyone with any information to contact the team here at Crewe on 101, quoting IML 211605 or by going online at cheshire.police.uk/contact/general-enquiries."

I have been working with the local speed watch teams and also getting out on the roads with our police speed-gun, as the main issue that has been raised at our community beat meetings is speeding in Dane Valley. We will continue our efforts in reducing excess speed on our roads, and if you have any concerns of a specific road in your area please do not hesitate to contact us so we can look into it further.

Furthermore as this is a priority that is being raised by residents, we are looking at another traffic enforcement day in Dane Valley where we will be focusing on the weight restriction in the village and the fatal four offences – 'speeding, driving whilst on a mobile phone, drug/drink driving and not wearing a seatbelt'. Watch this space!

I would also like to take this opportunity to advertise our new social media pages which have been created specifically for Dane Valley. This means that we are able to speak directly to you as our community about incidents and crimes we are finding in the area. Parish Council News

The Parish Council have been liaising with Cheshire East Highways to optimise the function of the new pedestrian crossing in the centre of the Village. The timings have been adjusted with further observations continuing to take place. The information below shows how to safely use the crossing.



Puffin crossings make crossing the road easier and safer. They have the Red/Green Man signals on the same side of the road as you are waiting to cross, allowing you to watch these signals and traffic at the same time. On other types of crossings, Red/Green Man signals are normally on the other side of the road.

<h3>1 STOP</h3> <p>Before you cross the road at a Puffin crossing, look at the Red/Green Man box.</p> <p>It will be on your side of the road, usually to your right as you face the road.</p>  <p>Push button Wait for signal</p>	<h3>2 WAIT</h3> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> → If the Green Man is showing, make sure the traffic has stopped in both directions before crossing the road. → If the Red Man is showing, do not cross the road. → Push the button on the Red/Green Man box and stand where you can clearly see the box. → Make sure the indicator beside the button lights up. The indicator stays lit until the box shows the Green Man. → If the indicator light goes out and the Green Man is not showing, push the button again and wait for the Green Man. 	<h3>3 CROSS</h3>  <p>When the Green Man shows and the traffic has stopped in both directions, cross the road with care.</p> <p>Don't worry if you can't see the Red/Green Man signals when crossing. The traffic lights will stay red for drivers in both directions until you reach the other side of the road, allowing you to cross in safety.</p>

What	How to Read the English country Church

It is possible to 'read' the passage of time, of movements, cultures and peoples in the architecture and art forms evident in many of our older English country churches. From the pre-Christian era, through the arrival of the Romans and onwards to the sixteenth century and the epoch changing Tudors, simple indicators are given how to identify churches with Roman and Saxon origins. The great flowering of Romanesque and Gothic architecture that followed the invasion of the Normans in the eleventh century are explained with illustrated examples. Onwards into the high Middle Ages and the tumultuous changes of the Reformation we can see the architectural and structural evidence of a period of great change.

A graduate of Selwyn College, Cambridge, Rev Dr Nicholas Henderson trained for the Anglican ministry at Ripon Hall, Oxford. He has a particular interest in the period of the English Reformation and the associated cultural, architectural and social changes it has produced. He lectures regularly and currently works as a parish priest in West London.
