NEWS Chairman's News November 2024



Well, here we are just one month away from our 2024 Christmas Market and Fair. If you were planning to have a stall this year and have not already applied then you may have missed the boat, but as we always have a few cancellations, it's not too late to get onto our reserve list. Applications should be made in the first instance via our website.

If you are new to the village or have never managed to get along to the Christmas Market in the past, then you should make a note for your diary today. The event is always held on the first Sunday of December,

so this year it falls on Sunday 1st. This will be the fourth year that we will close the centre of our village (The Square) from Costa Coffee down to the Fire Station, and then Parkway right around to the Tesco/St Luke Church car park. Again, this year we will have over 40 market stalls along the Square, our food and drink stalls on Parkway, with another 10 stalls inside the Scout Hall. Joe White and his team will again transform the car park into a quite fantastic fairground which has rides and entertainment that appeals to all ages.

As always, we need to bolster our small Partnership team with as many volunteers as we can find to run the Christmas Market. So, if you are reading this and thinking, yes I should get more involved in my village community then go to our website now and put your name down to be a volunteer at our Christmas Market, <u>https://www.hcpartnership.org.uk/jobs/christmas-market-stewards</u>. All we need is a couple of hours of your time, as we work with a rota allowing people to offer time before, during or after the market depending on what time you can spare.

It's also a great opportunity for the businesses within our village centre to showcase what they have to offer. Patron Sponsorship

The Holmes Chapel Partnership was formed in 2012 following Queen Elizabeth's Diamond Jubilee. At that time Cheshire East Council (CEC) agreed to provide funding of £8000 a year to 5 Local Partnership groups, which it continued to do for 10 years. However in January 2023 CEC informed us that they could no longer continue to fund the Partnerships due to an increased demand for funds to deliver statutory services. The Alsager and Middlewich Partnership groups subsequently folded.

To ensure that we could continue to work with the Holmes Chapel community we took the unprecedented decision to seek funding from local companies who might like to support our activities through a Patron Sponsorship Scheme. It is therefore with great delight that I can confirm that Holmes Chapel Parish Council, Dutton Builders Merchants, Hurstwood Holdings and Massey Feeds are Patron Sponsors for a second year, as well as TMC who continue to support the Partnership through their PR services.

Household waste recycling centres – booking system

It's quick and easy to do: <u>Book a slot at a household waste recycling centre</u>. So that we can manage queues and people's waiting times, visitors won't be allowed to enter the site if they haven't pre-booked or are late arriving for their slot. **You do not need to book if they are visiting us during a weekday**.

Holmes Chapel Pride

Holmes Chapel Railway Station Corner

The Information from our little booklets on sale at Holmes Chapel Railway Station goes far and wide. For example 'Aspects of the History of Holmes Chapel Railway Station, Viaduct and the Swan Inn' (now in its 2nd edition) came to the attention of the relatives of one of the people who passed away in the rail accident,

here at the station, on the 14th September 1941 - during the blackouts of the Second World War. Ann Gibbins, the grand-daughter of John W. Gregory who died in the rail crash, and her husband Allan made the trip from Leyland to Holmes Chapel recently (just two hours by Northern Rail). Ann spent her working life in nursing and Allan in computer engineering. The Volunteers and Friends of Holmes Chapel Railway Station & Viaduct and Sarah Morgan from the Community Rail Partnership attended a short ceremony for a new plaque which we fixed to the bench in front of the booking office (a well-used bench on dry days!)

I said: "This dedication is for the victims of the tragic rail crash, whose lives were taken far too soon. We honour their memory, holding in our hearts the pain and grief the families and communities bear. In this moment of sorrow, we are reminded of the fragility of life and the deep connections that bind us all. May the memories of those lost be a source of strength and inspiration, and may we work together to ensure the legacy leads to greater safety and care for all. Our thoughts and prayers remain with those who mourn, as we offer our deepest condolences and commitment to never forget".



Mr and Mrs Gibbins left a generous donation and we have planted special dwarf daffodil bulbs in some of the station planters which we look forward to see flowering in the Spring.

Home Grown in Holmes Chapel



It has been a very blustery few weeks and many of the fruit on our trees in the orchard have fallen to the ground.



We have collected some of the apples, firstly for the whole community, and we will put the apples on the community table by the Health Centre for anyone to take.

Secondly we have taken some to the Old Saw Mill in Congleton to be made into apple juice.

On November 2nd we will be having our final dig of the year. Instead of being at our usual base of the Health Centre, we will be in the orchard in the Dane Meadow. Here we will be picking apples and collecting the windfalls. We will also be winter pruning the trees and putting grease bands on the trees. Winter pruning is for better fruit next year. The grease bands stop bugs from over wintering in the trees and infecting next years fruit. If you'd like to join us, come along between 10am and 12noon.

As usual, we will have a table at the Christmas fair on 1st December where we will be selling home made jam, marmalade, chutney and cakes. We will also have other local produce to sell such as eggs and honey. We will also have our popular raffle.

Please come along and buy our goods as we have an exciting opportunity next year but we do need a bit more cash.

Hopefully, in the next newsletter, we will be able to give more details.

Dane Meadow Update

You may remember that the big news from last month was the restoration of the pond. The liner of the previous pond was no longer watertight and consequently the water level dropped, the area got "over vegetated" and was mostly dry during the summer months. In order to recreate the pond the self-seeded willow trees from the edge were removed as they were sucking water out of the area and some of the vegetation at the back as well, so that it will be possible to walk around the new pond. This time there is a triple layer of lining, so let's wait and see how this performs!



Since the works were completed it hardly seems to have stopped raining and the pond is filling up nicely without any outside help. The contractor has now removed the builders' fencing which was protecting the pond liner before it was covered with water. The area around the pond has been sown with grass seed which is already beginning to grow but because of the amount of rain we have had the whole area is extremely muddy and slippy. The original wooden frog statue is due to be re-instated in the next few weeks

The soil and vegetation that resulted from digging out the pond has been piled next to it. This pile of earth seemed ideal territory for planting cornfield annuals - unlike the perennial wildflowers on the flat grassy area of the Meadow, cornfield annuals need bare soil to flourish and cannot compete with luscious swathes of grass. With cornflowers, poppies and marigolds they do however make quite a splash when planted en masse.

With money from the fund set aside for the Dane Meadow the Friends purchased the appropriate mix of seeds and set about raking the area and sowing the seeds during their October session. The advice is to plant either in the autumn or in the spring so we have hedged our bets and planted half the seeds now and will plant the rest in spring in the hope of creating a stunning display.

If you look carefully you can see that many of the seeds have already germinated (see photo right) so if you could avoid walking over the mound that would really help them



flourish and produce - fingers crossed- a display like this (see photo left) next summer.

Bringing the village together as part of celebrating Christmas was just one of Eileen's visions and she achieved this on Christmas Eve 2003 when three hundred people gathered to sing Carols on the patio at the carpet shop. Before moving closer to her family in 2012, Eileen put plans in place with her friends for the Carol Singing to continue and now gathering on the patio at the George and Dragon, our Community will have the opportunity to continue Eileen's legacy and come together to sing Carols on Christmas Eve 2024.

It isn't just through the Carol Singing that Eileen touched many lives; from moving to Holmes Chapel in 1985 her boundless energy, enthusiasm, encouragement and wicked sense of humour brought care and joy to many. Eileen might have encouraged you to take part in Charity walks across the dangerous sands of Morecambe Bay or there again she might have commandeered you to be part of a rota, working with the Salvation Army, to man the Breakfast Van feeding the homeless in the centre of Manchester. Eileen was one of the best at finding opportunities to raise funds for Charities and for finding volunteers to help, for ten years it was the NSPCC and St Luke's Hospice which benefited from her coordinating a Christmas Lunch held at Cranage Hall. Ladies Circle, in later years Tangent, of which Eileen was a member, neighbours and friends will be able to reminisce of the imaginative, full of fun evenings which Eileen organised and which all had 'thinking of others' as their heart of a good night out!

Sadly, for the last few years Eileen lived with dementia and on 20 September died. In her memory, and in appreciation of what Eileen did for our village, we hope that as many who are able, come along to the Community Carol Singing on Christmas Eve.

Over the years the Carol Singing collections have raised more than £13000 both for local charities and The Christie but this year we hope that people will give even more generously as the buckets will be shaken to collect for the **Alzheimer's Society** and a request will be made for our donations to be put towards research in finding a cure for this cruel disease.


